- 2. Read Acts 7:1-8.
  - a. In the context of defending the spread of the gospel message, why do you think Stephen talks about Abraham's nomadic lifestyle as the starting point of his defense?
- 3. Read Acts 7:9-16.
  - a. Name the ways that God took Joseph's bad situations and turned them into good.
  - b. Can you think of a time that someone intended evil, but God turned it to good?
- 4. Read Acts 7:17-22.
  - a. What bad situation was Moses in, and how was he rescued?
  - b. Can you think of a time when God or another person provided rescue or a way out of a difficult situation?

5.	Read Acts 7:23-29.  a. How did Moses try to rescue the Israelites, and how did they respond?
	b. Can you think of a time when God or another person offered you a rescue plan, but you refused to accept it? Why didn't you accept it?
6.	Read Acts 7:30-43.  a. How did God provide rescue to the Israelites?
	b. What was their response?
	c. Can you think of a time that you rejected a rescue plan, but either God or another person rescued you anyway? How did it make you feel?
7.	Read Acts 7:44-50.  a. How do the Israelites try to constrict God in these verses?
	b. Can you think of some ways that you try to constrict God?
	c. Which areas of your life are open to God? Which are closed?

8.		Acts 7:51-53. How does Stephen challenge the Jewish leaders on points of theology?
	b.	Can you think of a time when you have had to confront someone over a misinterpretation of scripture? What was their response?
	C.	Has someone had to confront you? What was your response?
9.		Acts 7:54-60 How did the Jewish respond to Stephen's accusations against them?
	b.	What was Stephen's response to their behavior?
	C.	Can you think of a time that you forgave someone for something serious? What was the result?
	d.	Has anyone had to forgive you of something serious? What was the result?
